DISCUSSION GUIDE

GOSPEL OF JOHN

John 6:1-15

CONTEXT

This is the fourth of seven signs in John's gospel. Besides the resurrection of Jesus, it is the only miracle that is recorded in all four gospels (see Matthew 14:12-21, Mark 6:30-44, Luke 9:10-17). Compared to the other accounts, John's account provides a few unique details, particularly verses 14-15. Overall, the event invites us to consider how to respond to life's impossible situations and to a Savior who does the impossible.

STRUCTURE OF THE TEXT

6:1-4 Setting

6:5-9 An Impossible Situation

6:10-13 The Lord of the Impossible

6:14-15 A Self-Interested Response

EXPLORING THE TEXT

1. How does Jesus respond when he sees "a large crowd" coming toward him?
2. J.C. Ryle says that Jesus "tested" Philip (vv5-6) because "our Lord knows the sluggishness and coldness of our hearts, and He sees it good to stir our spiritual senses, and draw forth our spiritual desires by such a mode of dealing with us" (John Vol 1, p332). In what ways has your faith been tested recently? How did you receive the time of testing?
3. In what ways can you relate to Philip who only saw the impossibility of the situation?
4. Consider the details of the miracle in vv8-13. What does this reveal about sufficiency and adequacy of the work of Jesus, even with life's impossible situations?
5. How else in Scripture do we see God do much, even the seemingly impossible, from little to nothing?
6. How do the people respond when they "saw the sign that he had done"?
7. What does Jesus's response to the king-making crowd reveal about his kingdom and his purposes?

CONCLUSIONS

1. How does Jesus's ability to do much, even the impossible, from little to nothing encourage you in whatever impossible situation you are facing right now?
2. How are you tempted to approach Jesus with a self-interested, kingdom-making agenda, rather than in surrender to the kingdom of humility that he is establishing?
3. Consider how at the Cross Jesus made a way for what is impossible for us to be possible, namely, to be forgiven of our sins and welcomed into His kingdom, a kingdom which is not of this world. How does this lead you to praise and give thanks to God?
