DISCUSSION GUIDE

GOSPEL OF JOHN

John 5:19-47

CONTEXT

Jesus has just healed an invalid man on the Sabbath. When the Jewish leaders learn about it, they “were persecuting Jesus” (5:16). In response, Jesus told them, “My Father is working until now, and I am working” (5:17). At this, the Jewish leaders “were seeking all the more to kill [Jesus],” because he was “making himself equal with God” (5:18). How does Jesus’s response invite us to hear his voice and believe in him?

STRUCTURE OF THE TEXT

- 5:19-30 Jesus only does what he sees His Father doing
- 5:31-47 Jesus’ testimony is true because of several witnesses

EXPLORING THE TEXT

1. What does this text say about the relationship between Jesus and God the Father?
2. What two “greater works” has the Father given to the Son (see vv20-22)? How is this connected to the “authority” the Father gives the Son?
3. Jesus makes three “truly, truly, I say to you” statements. What are they and how are they connected to one another?
4. According to these verses, what power does the voice of Jesus have?
5. Jesus says that there are several others who bear witness to who he is. What are these witnesses and what do they share in common (see vv31-47)?
6. How does the cross and resurrection bear witness to who Jesus is?

CONCLUSIONS

1. Why is it important that Jesus only does what the Father sent him to do?
2. What voices are you tempted to listen to besides the voice of Jesus?
3. According to the text, why is Jesus’s voice the voice that we need to hear?
4. Hearing the voice of Jesus includes listening to and responding to His Word. What are areas of your life that you may be deaf, or hearing-impaired, to the Word of God?
5. How does knowing that Jesus went to the cross for our deafened ability to properly hear the voice of God lead you to worship and adore Him? How does it lead you to repent and seek forgiveness?
6. What changes can you make to better listen to and respond to the Word of God?
